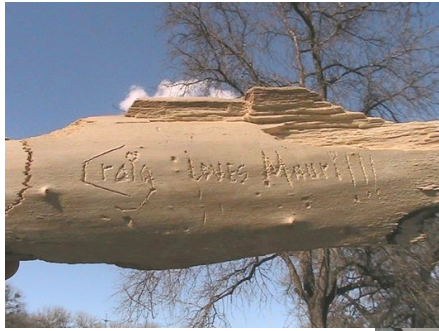

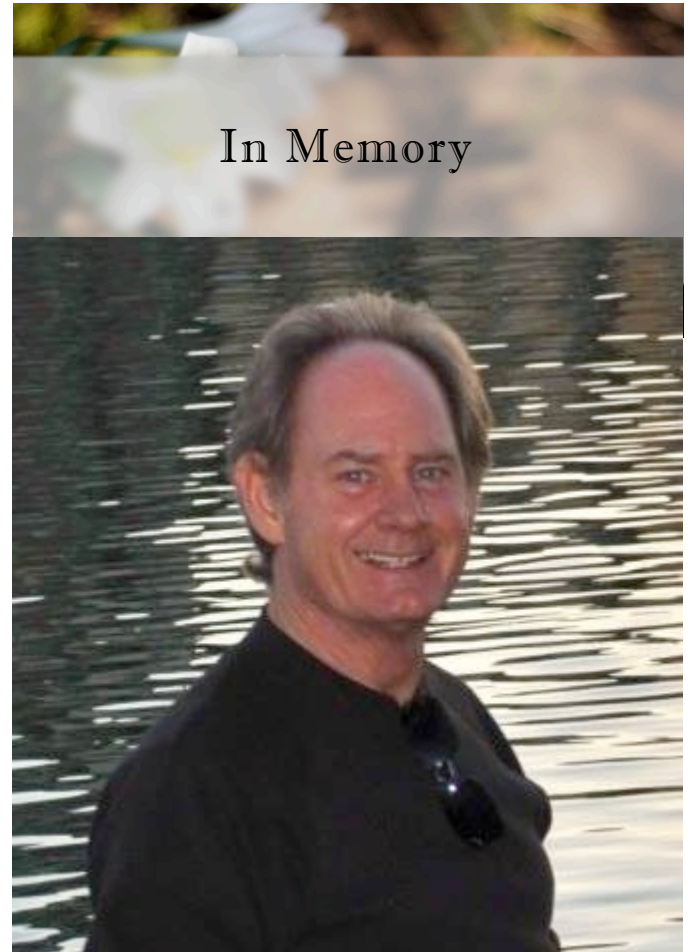

## Joel Craig Gandy



Joel Craig Gandy was born August 30, 1953, to Billy Joe and Triscia Gandy. Craig graduated from Ponca City High School, in Ponca City, Oklahoma, and went on to graduate from the University of Maryland, Livorno, Italy. Craig and Mauri Davenport met in November of 1987, and were united in marriage on February 14, 1989, in Marble Falls, Texas.

Prior to his ministry with JCI, Craig served 12 years in the U.S. Army as Army Staff Sgt and spent most of his military career in Germany. Craig was actively involved and instrumental in JCI Productions and the broadcast of JCI Austin Live, a Christian-based televised program seen locally on Channel 11. Craig, Mauri, and children have been producing, broadcasting, and ministering in this program for over five years.

Craig has established lifelong friends through this network and because of his own strong faith and ministry of God's Word, he has brought many individuals to the cross, accepting Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior and becoming active believers and followers of Christ.

Craig is survived by his wife: Mauri (Davenport); his children: Jeffrey, Jonathan, and Jamie (all of Austin), Jason and Jennifer (Germany); a brother Steve and wife Jan; and a sister Becky Huff and husband Rick (Houston); mother Triscia Hadicke and step-father Roger Hadicke (Oklahoma).

He was preceded in death by his father, Billy Joe Gandy.
